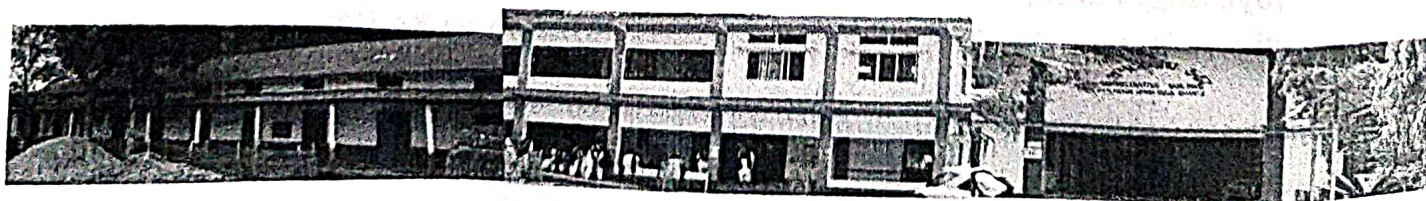

COLLEGE UNIFORM

COURSE STRUCTURE

About Dibrugarh University Regulations for the Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) In Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) from the Academic Session, 2023-2024

Based on the new curricular framework as envisaged under the New Education Policy, 2020 by University Grants Commission (UGC) on the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS); Dibrugarh University designed the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) to provide multidisciplinary and holistic education, student centric, flexible choice based credit system with multiple entries/exits options to obtain a Certificate or a Diploma or Degree with or without Major or a Degree (Honours) or a Degree (Honours) with Research at various levels as stipulated under the policy. This is called Dibrugarh University Regulation for the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) and it is applicable for all the affiliated/permitted College of Dibrugarh University.

Undergraduate Programme will include the following:

- 1. UG Certificate Programme:** Students shall be awarded UG certificate in the Field of Study/Discipline after completing 1 year (both 1st and 2nd Semester) with requisite 44 credits on completion of 2nd Semester. In addition to this they have to complete one work based/skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 2nd semester examination.
- 2. UG Diploma Programme:** Students shall be awarded UG Diploma in the Field of Study/Discipline after securing the requisite 88 credits on completion of 2 years (4 semesters). In addition to this they have to complete one work based/ skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits one year from the completion of 4th semester examination.
- 3. Three Year UG Degree Programme (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelors in other disciplines) with single/double major:** Students who wish to undergo a 3-year (6 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing a minimum of 132 credits. Provision of double Major shall be implemented in due course of time.
- 4. Four Year UG Programme with honours (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelors in other disciplines) with single/double major:** Students who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG Programme shall be awarded UG Honours degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of four years, securing a minimum of 176 credits. Provision of double Major shall be implemented in due course of time.

5. **Four Year UG Programme with honours with Research (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelors in other disciplines) with single/double major:** Students who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG Programme shall be awarded UG Honours and research degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of four years with a rigorous research project, securing a minimum of 176 credits. Provision of double Major shall be implemented in due course of time.

FYUGP of Dibrugarh University has the following provisions:

1. **Multiple Exits and Entries:** FYUGP allows the students to have multiple exits and entries i.e. a student can exit the programme, say after one year and then again can enter the programme at a later time and can continue the programme from where he/she left if they fulfil the minimum eligibility criteria as given in Dibrugarh University Regulation.
2. **Academic Bank of Credits (ABC):** As per the Dibrugarh University Regulation for FYUGP, all the credits of a student earn at the end of an examination will be deposited in the ABC account where the students have to register through ABC portal as notified by the University.

The entire Dibrugarh University FYUGP curriculum has the following categories of courses:

1. Major Discipline
 - Major Course (Core)
2. Minor Discipline
3. Multidisciplinary Generic Elective
4. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)
5. Value Added Courses (VAC)
6. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)
7. Community Engagement
8. Field based learning/Project
9. Internship
10. Research Project/Dissertation

As per the availability of the courses in our college student can choose their courses based on their interest.

COURSE ENROLMENT:

Change in Major: Students shall be allowed to change major within the broad discipline at the end of the second semester by giving him/her sufficient time to explore interdisciplinary courses during the first year.

Change in Minor: Students shall be allowed to change Minor courses of his/her areas of interest within the broad discipline at the end of the third semester

Attendance: A student should have at least 80% of attendance during the total number of class days. A student who has less than 80% attendance in average shall not be permitted to sit for the End Semester Examination.

Betterment Examination: A student shall be entitled to take the Betterment Examination in any two theory courses after successful completion of 3 year/ 4 year programme only once. No betterment shall be allowed in the practical/project/dissertation/internship examination.

FACILITIES FOR STUDENTS

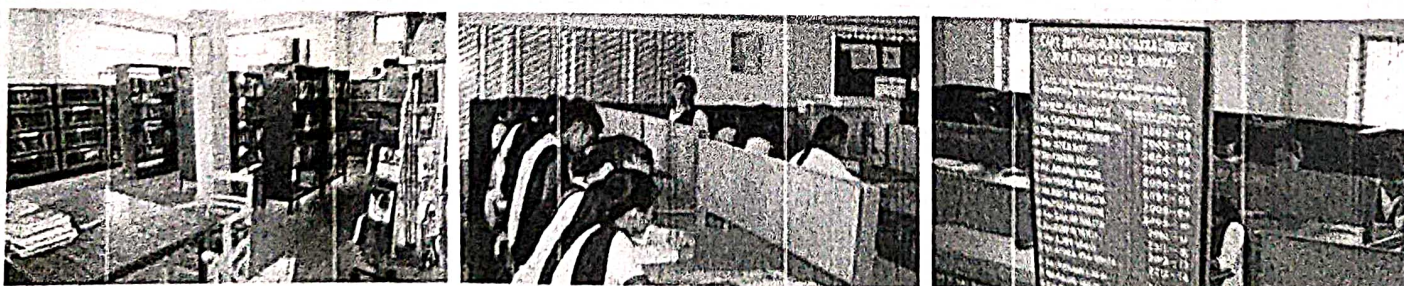
A) CAPT. JINTU GOGOI, VIR CHAKRA LIBRARY:

The Captain Jintu Gogoi, Vir Chakra Library is the central Library of Joya Gogoi College, Khumtai established in the year 1992. The Library has been named as 'Capt. Jintu Gogoi, Vir Chakra Library' as a mark of respect to the Kargil Martyr Capt. Jintu Gogoi in the year 2004. The Library has a collection of 16,250 books including both university prescribed textbooks and a good number of reference books on each subject. Besides the subject-oriented reference books on each as World Classic Books, General and Subject Encyclopedia, Yearbooks, Atlas, Dictionaries, Books on woman related issues, books on different issues of North-east India, collection of award winning books of Sahitya Akademi, books on performing Art, Career guidance, Computer Science etc.

The library has 20 journals/ periodical and 6 newspapers. Out of 20 periodicals, 7 are peer-reviewed journals, one discussing journal on International Relation and foreign policy. The Library is also registered under the N-LIST consortium which provides access to 6000+ electronic journals and lots of e-books of world-class publishers. Besides the day to day activities, the library also provides the following services:

1. Book Bank Services.
2. Reprographic Services
3. Current Awareness Service
4. Counseling Services
5. Newspaper Clipping Services

The Library provide "Late Priya Baruah & Late Girish Bora Memorial Best Reader Award" from the session 2003-04 And also provide "Late Romon Gogoi memorial best E-resource user award" from the session 2021-22 to one student for each academic session to inculcate the reading habit among the students.



B. GIRLS' HOSTEL

The college has a well secured Girls' Hostel. It provides seat accommodation for 40 students. The Hostel is well furnished and it provides pure drinking water and clean sanitation facilities. It has the provision for separate Visiting, Kitchen, Dining and Bedrooms. It also extends electronic audio-visual services e.g. television set at the dining room which is primarily meant for using to explore the educational values of programmes by students.

C. REMEDIAL CLASSES

In addition to the general classes, the college also provides the remedial coaching classes after the end of general routine classes each day. No additional fees will be charged for remedial classes. For details, contact at Principal's Office.

D. COLLEGE CANTEEN

There is a college canteen within the college campus which is run in a free furnished structure provides by the college and supervised by a committee constituted for the purpose.

E. SPORTS, MUSIC AND DRAMATICS

The College provides adequate facilities for games, music and dramatical activities for both boys and girls. Regular practice and competition are held under the supervision of experienced teachers and students showing proficiency are encouraged to take part in the inter college competitions organized at various level.

We are very much glad to add here that recently we have completed the construction of our indoor stadium in Campus C which was funded by UGC. Students now can avail the sports facility in Badminton and Table Tennis in this indoor stadium.

F. GYMNASIUM

The college has recently installed as up to date gymnasium block in the campus. It has been complete with a fund from RUSA (Rastriya Uchcharat Siksha Abhiyyan). About 20 students can practices at a time in this gymnasium.

G. SEXUAL HARASSMENT CELL

The college has a sexual harassment cell constituted by a group of faculty of the college. The cell guides the students under this cell through various activities like awareness programmes and seminar etc.

ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION IN THE EVENT OF RAGGING:

The University shall issue an order to punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure, and in the manner prescribed here in under.

- A) The Anti-Ragging Committee of the Institution shall take appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendations of the anti-ragging squad.
- B) The anti-ragging committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the anti-ragging squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments:
- i. Suspension from Attending Classes and Academic Privileges.
 - ii. Withholding/ Withdrawing Scholarship/ Fellowship and other Benefits.
 - iii. Debarring from Appearing in any Test/ Examination or other Evaluation Process.
 - iv. Withholding results.
 - v. Debarring from representing the institution in any Regional, National or International Meet, Tournament, Youth Festival, etc.
 - vi. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
 - vii. Cancellation of admission.
 - viii. Rustication from the institution for a period ranging from one to four semesters.
 - ix. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
 - x. Fine of 10,000 /- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) or with imprisonment up to 6 months as per the Assam Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1999.
 - xi. To undertake patrolling and make surprise visits to places vulnerable to incidents of ragging.

GENERAL RULES FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE AMONG STUDENTS:

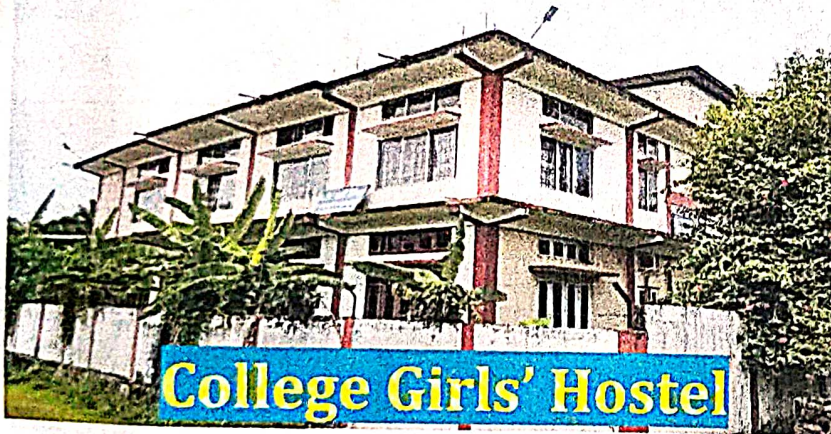
- (i) All forms of ragging in college campus are prohibited. Ragging is now prohibited by law as well. FIR will be lodged in Police Station for any such offence.
