AIMS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE COLLEGE:

Based on the experience of rural environment and contemporary overall changing perspectives the college aims at:

- 1 Imparting quality higher education to the socio-economically backward rural communities living in this remote part of Golaghat District.
- 2 Becoming a catalyst of all-round development of students in particular and neighboring communities in general.
- 3 Generating awareness and execution of plans for self-resource mobilization of the institution.
- 4 Providing vocational/ career oriented training programmes in different fields of work to the rural students/people, subject to the institutional funds in this regard.
- 5 Working for preservation and distribution of multi-coloured art and culture of different communities living in this locality.
- 6 To achieve the above broad objectives, the college has taken newer initiatives to form and execute a number of communities/ unions/ cells and their relevant programmes from time to time.

COLLEGE CAMPUS:

The college has a clean, beautiful and suitable academic atmosphere having four campuses i.e. A, B, C & D. The existing Campuses A & B are situated at the heart of Khumtai and by both sides of historic Dhodar Ali. Another campus C is half kilometre away from the A & B Campus of the College.

The Campus A is allotted for the major class rooms, the museum, the Office for the Career Guidance and Counseling Cell, the Office for the Alumni Association and Guardians Association. The Administrative Block, class rooms, Library, Auditorium, Teachers' Common room, the girls hostel and Canteen etc. are conveniently located in the campus B.

COURSES OF STUDY

A. HS Course (Arts):

- i. Students is compulsory.
- ii. Students will have to opt for one of the following subjects:
 - (a) Modern Indian Language (MIL) Assamese or
 - (b) Ak- English.
- iii. Elective Subjects: A student can select maximum of four subjects from the following:
 - a) Economics. b) Political Science. c) Education.
 - d) Advance Assamese. e) Mathematics. f) History.

B. (i) BA Course (Semester):

From 2011-12 Session Semester System has been introduced by Dibrugarh University in the colleges under it. Under this Semester System courses of study from degree of Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science and Bachelor of Commerce shall be of three years duration distributed in six semesters with two semesters in an academic year of 12 months.

A student may choose either the General Course (Pass Course) or Major Course.

The course now (2019-20) will be applicable to students studying 3rd & 5th Semester only.

(ii) BA Course (CBCS):

The CBCS course has been introduced by Dibrugarh University for its affiliated colleges from the year 2019-20. Details of the course design is enclosed herewith in Annexure-I (in Assamese)

MAJOR COURSES:

The college offers major courses in Economics, Political Science, History, Education, Assamese & English.

SCIENCE STREAM

As per announcement of Govt. of Assam, the college introduced Science Stream in Higher Secondary Courses from this session. Subject combination for Science Stream is as follows:

- A. General English- Compulsory
- B. MIL (Assamese/ Alternative English) - Compulsory
- C. Elective (any four) - (i) Physics (ii) Chemistry (iii) Biology (iv) Computer Science
- (v) Mathematics (vi) Biotechnology

OTHER COURSES:

I. (a) SELF FINANCING CAREER ORIENTED COURSE:

The college has run the following self-financing courses for student's career building.

- (i) Three (3) months Certificate Course on Spoken English.
- (ii) Six (6) months Certificate Course on Beautification and cosmetology.
- (iii) Three (3) months Certificate Course on Cutting, Knitting and embroidery.
- (iv) Three (3) months Certificate Course on Food and Fruit Preservation.
- (v) Three months certificate course on Assistant Electrician under PMVKY



II. UGC SERVICES

CAREER GUIDANCE & ENTRY INTO SERVICES CELL.

Initially, the College started the cell in 2004 with its own limited resources. It was again revitalized by reconstructing its programmes just after receiving UGC funding in the session 2011-12. Since then, the Cell has been implementing a good number of well diversified programmes. The career counselling programmes with their various short term academic & professional courses are expected to enhance the skill & employability of college students & ex-students.

The programmes both on academic & professional courses that are being conducted includes teachings on personality development, development of soft skill, communicative ability, self employment, academic counselling etc. & also programmes of courses on different competitive examinations conducted by Banking, Insurance companies, State Education Boards, Public Service Commissions etc. The Cell also organizes some short-term professional courses on computer education such as Tally, BCA etc. Most of the programmes/ courses offered by the cell are being/ will be conducted during vacations including Sundays in a session.

UGC Sponsored Computer Education Centre

Today, computer is the very need to the students as well as the society in every spheres of life. Keeping this in view, a well equipped and well-furnished UGC Sponsored Computer Education Centre has been established at Joya Gogoi College in 2012.

The computer education centre has been offering job-oriented 'Introductory Computer Education' courses along with the general courses. From its very inception, the centre has been running successfully and producing a good number of students every year.

The duration of the course is one year and it is divided into two semesters. Each semester is for the period of six months. There will be two papers for each Semester. The marks for each paper are as follows -

- 1. Semester I
 - (i) Paper - I (Theory) - marks - 100
 - (ii) Paper - II (Practical) - marks - 100
- 2. Semester II
 - (i) Paper - I (Theory) - marks - 100
 - (ii) Paper - II (Practical) - marks - 100

The admission for Semester - I is 1st week of January and admission for Semester - II is 1st week of July every year. Classes are conducted during off periods of the general class routine.

UGC SPONSORED CERTIFICATE COURSE ON EPOCH MAKING THINKER SWAMI VIVEKANANDA

Keeping in view the major aims of NAAC quality education and our commitment for community development, we are pleased to run a course mainly for moral and ethical development of students in the shape of - 'A Certificate Course on Epoch Making Thinker Swami Vivekananda' - which is approved and sponsored by University Grants Commission.

In our present social system, Swami Vivekananda's ideology based on renunciation and service is most relevant. Actually his ideas on education was real education and it will create real men for the country.

Keeping in view the importance of Vivekananda's idea, College introduced six months course on the 'Life and Vision of Swami Vivekananda' in 2011.

This particular course will be pursued over in a period of six months. The examination will be held in the 5th month from the starting of the course. The course contains 3 (three) papers (Paper - I, II & III) containing 100 marks in each. Paper - I and II are based on theory and concepts of Swami Vivekananda and Paper - III is based on practical, holding Project Report, Seminar and Assignment etc.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENT & PROCEDURE OF ADMISSION

A. for Higher Secondary course:

To be eligible for admission into 1st year class of H.S. a student has to pass H.S.L.C. Examination conducted by SEBA or any other equivalent exam conducted by other boards/ councils recognised by competent governmental authority.

Admission Procedure:

Online application form for admission into different courses of the college is available in its website www.joyagogoi.org. The prospectus of the college will be made available to students at per unique code linked to online admission.

There are reservations for SC/ST students having outstanding performance in the field of culture/sports/NCC as per government rules. The date of interviews for admission into to various classes will be notified in advance. The candidate shall have to present personally in the interview with the following in original.

- i. Provisional Pass Certificate from the Head of the Institution attended last ii. Mark sheet. iii. Gap Period Certificate (if needed).
- iv. Two copies of recent passport size photographs.
- v. Caste Certificate by SC/ST/OBE/TGL candidates.

Filled in Admission Form shall be submitted along with the attached copies of all supporting documents to the college office within the notified date. Admission into the college is made strictly in order of merit and is governed by the college admission rule.

Students who failed to get promotion to the next higher classes may also apply for admission along with the fresh application. Student detained in a class for consecutive years will not be admitted to the regular classes of the college.



B. For Bachelor of Arts Under Semester System :

To be eligible for admission, a student has to pass H.S. in Arts conducted by A.H. S.E.C. or any other equivalent exams recognized by Dibrugarh University.

Admission Procedure :

Application for admission into the college should be made in the prescribed form available along with prospectus which is to be issued immediately after the announcement of result of H.S.S.L.C. examination. However admission into semester classes will be held according to the direction of Dibrugarh University. The admission form should be detached from the prospectus and after filling it up completely should be submitted to the college office within the notified date. Admission to the college will be made strictly on Merit and subject to approval of the Principal.

RESERVATION

Seat reservation facilities are available for SC/ST students, physically challenged and sports persons of outstanding performance in the field of sports, culture NCC etc. as per government rules.

The college authority reserves the right to accept or reject any application for admission without assigning any reason. The overall responsibility of selection and admission in to different classes rests on the decision of the Admission Committee. The date of interview for admission in to various classes are notified in advance. The candidate are to attend personally in the interview with the following documents and papers in original.

- Provisional Pass Certificate from the Head of the Institution attended last.
- Mark sheet.
- Gap Period Certificate (if needed).
- Two copies of recent Passport size photographs.
- Caste Certificate by SC/ST/OBC/TGL candidates.

Filled in Admission Form shall be submitted along with the attached copies of all supporting documents to the college office within the notified date. Admission into the college is made strictly in order of merit and is governed by the college admission rule.

The medium of instruction is both Assamese and English.

**GENERAL RULES FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE AMONG STUDENTS**

Due emphasis is laid on discipline and character building of students. All powers of maintaining discipline are vested with the principal and his/her decision shall be final in such matters. The following activities of the students in the college will be treated as serious offence.

- All forms of ragging in college campus are prohibited. Ragging is now prohibited by law as well. FIR will be lodged in Police Station for any such offence.
- Forceful disruption of classes.
- Distraction of college properties.
- Misbehaviour shown towards girls, ladies, teachers, employees of the college.
- Use of drugs, narcotics and smoking of cigarettes etc. inside the college campus.
- Any kind of activities detrimental to the academic atmosphere of the college.
- Every student must have his / her identity card while in the college.
- Scooters, motor cycles and bi-cycles are to be kept at the allotted spaces.
- Only Societies/ Associations recognized by the Principal shall have the facility of the college campus.
- All notices desired to be posted or circulated by any student anywhere in college shall require the prior approval of the Principal.
- To be a regular student of the college, a student must attend 80% or more of the classes in each subject.
- For any pass certificate (provisional) and character certificate, the students need to apply to the principal giving detailed information of the matter concerned.
- Mobile phone is strictly prohibited in the college campus.
- Smoking, chewing of betel nut, gutka etc., alcoholic drinks and any sorts of drugs are strictly forbidden. Spitting inside the class room leading to expell from the college without considering any excuse.

COLLEGE UNIFORM

The college student uniform is navy blue trousers and white shirt for boys and white Chador-Mekhela with blue border and blue blouse/ White Chandrar and blue dupatta for girls' student. Without uniform students are not allowed to enter into the college campus.

EXAMINATION AND EXAMINATION RULES

- Sessional Test examination for all the classes will be held conveniently in keeping with the dates of examinations notified by the College authority.
- The respective departments will be held periodical examinations in Major subjects independently and keep proper records for future guidance.
- Student attendance to all college examinations is obligatory. Failing to appear at those examinations, they will forfeit the chance of any consideration on the final examination.
- Those who remains absent at the Sessional Examination on Medical or other ground, their cases will not be considered.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT :

For Semester System Internal Assessment System to be continue as directed by Dibrugarh University.

ATTENDANCE RULES :

Attendance in classes is mandatory. Regular students having 80% of attendance will be eligible for appearing in the examination.

**FACILITIES FOR STUDENTS :****A) CAPT. JINTU GOGOI VIR CHAKRA LIBRARY :**

The Captain Jintu Gogoi, Vir Chakra Library is the central library of Joya Gogoi College established in the year 1992. The library has been named as 'Capt. Jintu Gogoi, Vir Chakra Library' as a mark of respect to the Kargil Martyr Capt. Jintu Gogoi in the year 2004. The library has a collection of 14,000 books including both university prescribed textbooks and a good number of reference books on each subject. Besides the subject-oriented reference books, the library has a rich collection of other reference books such as World Classic Books, General and Subject Encyclopedias, Yearbooks, Atlas, Dictionaries, Books on women related issues, books on different issues of North-east India, collection of award winning books of Sahitya Akademi, books on performing art, career guidance, computer science etc.

The library has 20 journals/ periodicals and 6 newspapers. Out of 20 periodicals, 7 are peer-reviewed journals, one discussing journal on International Relation and foreign policy. The library is also registered under the N-LIST consortium which provides access to 6000+ electronic journals and lots of e-books of world-class publishers. Besides the day to day activities, the library also provide the following services :

1. Book Bank Services.
2. Reprographic Services.
3. Current Awareness Services.
4. Counselling Services.
5. Newspaper Clipping Services.

The library also provide "Late Priya Bursah & Late Girish Bora Memorial Best Reader Award" to one student for each academic session to inculcate the reading habit among the students.

The library provide/ issue 4 books to each Major students and 2 books to core course students at a time for a period of 15 days.

B) GIRLS' HOSTEL :

There is a newly constructed (two storeys) well secured R.C.C. Girls' Hostel at the college. It provides seat accommodation for 30 students. The Hostel is well furnished and it provides pure drinking water and clean sanitation facilities. It has the provision for separate Visiting, Kitchen, Dining and Bed-rooms. It also extends electronic audio-visual services e.g. television set at the dining room which is primarily meant for using to exploit the educational values of programmes by students.

The Hostel is governed by the laws and by-laws of the Hostel ordinance. To administer the Hostel in a conducive manner, there is an Executive Committee headed by the Principal of the College. The Principal appoints the Hostel Supervisor and other staff members for its sound maintenance.

C) REMEDIAL CLASSES :

In addition to the general classes, the college also provides the remedial coaching classes after the end of general routine classes each day. No additional fees will be charged for remedial classes. For details, contact at Principal's office.

D) COLLEGE CANTEN :

There is a college canteen within the college campus which is run in a free furnished structure provided by the college and supervised by a committee constituted for the purpose.

E) GROUP INSURANCE SCHEME FOR STUDENTS :

There is a Group Life Insurance Scheme for the students under L.I.C. of India in the college.

F) GAMES, SPORTS, MUSIC AND DRAMATICS :

The college provides adequate facilities for games, music and dramatic activities for both boys and girls. Regular practice and competition are held under the supervision of experienced teachers and students showing proficiency are encouraged to take part in the inter college competitions organised at various level.

We are very much glad to add here that recently we have completed the construction of our indoor stadium in Campus C which was funded by UGC. Students now can avail the sports facility in Badminton and Table Tennis in this indoor stadium. Separate dressing rooms for both girls and boys are also available with sanitary facility. We take here the opportunity to offer our warm congratulations and best wishes to Shri Deben Raighat, Sri Naryan Ghatowar and Sri Phandihar Karmi for their achievements in Cross Country 12 k.m. marathon race in Inter-college Sports Competition, Dibrugarh University.

G) GYMNASIUM :

The college has recently installed as up-to-date gymnasium block in the campus. It has been completed with a fund from RUSA (Rastriya Uchchatar Siksha Abhiyan). About 20 students can practices at a time in this gymnasium.

H) SEXUALLY HARASSMENT CELL :

The college has a sexually harassment cell constituted by a group of faculty of the college. The cell guides the students under this cell through various activities like awareness programmes and seminar etc.

I) XEROX FACILITY :

The college authority offers Xerox facilities for every student at a very nominal rate.

J) COLLEGE TEACHERS' UNIT AID FUND :

FACILITIES FOR STUDENTS:

A) CAPT. JINTU GOGOI, VIR CHAKRA LIBRARY:

The Captain Jintu Gogoi, Vir Chakra Library is the central Library of Joya Gogoi College, Khumtai established in the year 1992. The Library has been named as 'Capt. Jintu Gogoi, Vir Chakra Library' as a mark of respect to the Kargil Martyr Capt. Jintu Gogoi in the year 2004. ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION IN THE EVENT OF RAGGING:

The University shall issue an order to punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure, and in the manner prescribed here in under.

- A) The Anti-Ragging Committee of the Institution shall take appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendations of the anti-ragging squad.
- B) The anti-ragging committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the anti-ragging squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments:
 - I. Suspension from Attending Classes and Academic Privileges.
 - II. Withholding/ Withdrawing Scholarship/ Fellowship and other Benefits.
 - III. Debarring from Appearing in any Test/ Examination or other Evaluation Process.

- IV. Withholding results.
- V. Debarring from representing the institution in any Regional, National or International Meet, Tournament, Youth Festival, etc.
- VI. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
- VII. Cancellation of admission.
- VIII. Rustication from the institution for a period ranging from one to four semesters.
- IX. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
- X. Fine of 10,000 /- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) or with imprisonment up to 6 months as per the Assam Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1999.
- XI. To undertake patrolling and make surprise visits to places vulnerable to incidents of ragging.

COURSE STRUCTURE

- a) Core Courses:** Compulsory components of an Academic Programme. These Courses are to be compulsorily studied as a core requirement for the programme. The contents of the Core Courses shall be as per the UGC Model Curriculum for the subject/ discipline concerned.
- b) Elective Courses:** Elective courses shall be chosen by each student from a pool of courses. These courses may be intra-departmental, i.e. Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) as well as inter-departmental, i.e., Generic Elective (GE). The students shall have to choose minimum number of DSE and GE in every semester as prescribed in the Course Structure.
- c) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):** The Ability Enhancement Courses shall be of two kinds- 'Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses' and 'Skill Enhancement Courses'. These courses shall be inter-disciplinary (within the Programme) in nature. 'AEC' Courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. i. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):(a) Environmental

Science (2 Credit), (b) Communicative English (2 Credit) and (c) Alternative English/Communicative Hindi /MIL (2 Credit). Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): (minimum 4 credits): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands on/training/fieldwork.

- d)** A Course may also take the form of a Dissertation/ Project work/ Practical training/ Field work/ Seminar.
- e)** A student shall have to study the academic programme as per the scheme of the Programme. Even if a candidate earns the required number of credits before completion of the full duration of the programme, he/she shall not be entitled for the degree.

Attendance:

A student who has less than 80% attendance in average shall not be permitted to sit for the End-semester examination. Provided that it shall be open to the University to grant exemption to a student who has attended a minimum of 70% classes but failed to obtain the prescribed 80% attendance for valid reasons, on recommendation of the Head/Chairperson/ Principals of the Department/ Centre/ College on payment of a prescribed fee(s).

Examination and Evaluation:

(a) Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis, at least three times during each semester. (b) There shall be 20% marks for internal assessment and 80% marks for End-semester examination in each course during every semester.

Results and Progression:

A candidate shall be declared as passed a course, provided he/ she secures- (i) at least 40% of marks in each Course in the End Semester Examinations. (ii) at least 'P' grade in the 10 point scale combining both the in-semester and End Semester Examination performance. (iii) There shall be no separate pass mark for Internal Assessment.

Grading System:

The absolute grading system shall be applied in evaluating performance of the students. The following scale of grading system shall be applied to indicate the performances of students in terms of letter grade and grade points as given below:

COURSE STRUCTURE

About Dibrugarh University Regulations for the Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) In Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) from the Academic Session, 2023-2024

Based on the new curricular framework as envisaged under the New Education Policy, 2020 by University Grants Commission (UGC) on the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS); Dibrugarh University designed the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) to provide multidisciplinary and holistic education, student centric, flexible choice based credit system with multiple entries/exits options to obtain a Certificate or a Diploma or Degree with or without Major or a Degree (Honours) or a Degree (Honours) with Research at various levels as stipulated under the policy. This is called Dibrugarh University Regulation for the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) and it is applicable for all the affiliated/permitted College of Dibrugarh University.

Undergraduate Programme will include the following:

1. **UG Certificate Programme:** Students shall be awarded UG certificate in the Field of Study/Discipline after completing 1 year (both 1st and 2nd Semester) with requisite 44 credits on completion of 2nd Semester. In addition to this they have to complete one work based/skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 2nd semester examination.
2. **UG Diploma Programme:** Students shall be awarded UG Diploma in the Field of Study/Discipline after securing the requisite 88 credits on completion of 2 years (4 semesters). In addition to this they have to complete one work based/ skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits one year from the completion of 4th semester examination.
3. **Three Year UG Degree Programme (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelors in other disciplines) with single/double major:** Students who wish to undergo a 3-year (6 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing a minimum of 132 credits. Provision of double Major shall be implemented in due course of time.
4. **Four Year UG Programme with honours (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelors in other disciplines) with single/double major:** Students who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG Programme shall be awarded UG Honours degree in the Major discipline after

successful completion of four years, securing a minimum of 176 credits. Provision of double Major shall be implemented in due course of time.

5. **Four Year UG Programme with honours with Research (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelors in other disciplines) with single/double major:** Students who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG Programme shall be awarded UG Honours and research degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of four years with a rigorous research project, securing a minimum of 176 credits. Provision of double Major shall be implemented in due course of time.

FYUGP of Dibrugarh University has the following provisions:

1. **Multiple Exits and Entries:** FYUGP allows the students to have multiple exits and entries i.e. a student can exit the programme, say after one year and then again can enter the programme at a later time and can continue the programme from where he/she left if they fulfil the minimum eligibility criteria as given in Dibrugarh University Regulation.
2. **Academic Bank of Credits (ABC):** As per the Dibrugarh University Regulation for FYUGP, all the credits of a student earn at the end of an examination will be deposited in the ABC account where the students have to register through ABC portal as notified by the University.

The entire Dibrugarh University FYUGP curriculum has the following categories of courses:

1. Major Discipline
 - Major Course (Core)
2. Minor Discipline
3. Multidisciplinary Generic Elective
4. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)
5. Value Added Courses (VAC)
6. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)
7. Community Engagement
8. Field based learning/Project
9. Internship
10. Research Project/Dissertation

As per the availability of the courses in our college student can choose their courses based on their interest.

Course Enrolment:

FACILITIES FOR STUDENTS:

A) CAPT. JINTU GOGOI, VIR CHAKRA LIBRARY:

The Captain Jintu Gogoi, Vir Chakra Library is the central Library of Joya Gogoi College, Khumtai established in the year 1992. The Library has been named as 'Capt. Jintu Gogoi, Vir Chakra Library' as a mark of respect to the Kargil Martyr Capt. Jintu Gogoi in the year 2004. The Library has a collection of 16,250 books including both university prescribed textbooks and a good number of reference books on each subject. Besides the subject-oriented reference books on each as World Classic Books, General and Subject Encyclopedia, Yearbooks, Atlas, Dictionaries, Books on woman related issues, books on different issues of North-east India, collection of award winning books of Sahitya Akademi, books on performing Art, Career guidance, Computer Science etc.

The library has 20 journals/ periodical and 6 newspapers. Out of 20 periodicals, 7 are peer-reviewed journals, one discussing journal on International Relation and foreign policy. The Library is also registered under the N-LIST consortium which provides access to 6000+ electronic journals and lots of e-books of world-class publishers. Besides the day to day activities, the library also provides the following services:

1. Book Bank Services.
2. Reprographic Services
3. Current Awareness Service

4. Counseling Services
5. Newspaper Clipping Services

The Library provide "Late Priya Baruah & Late Girish Bora Memorial Best Reader Award" from the session 2003-04 And also provide "Late Romon Gogoi memorial best E-resource user award" from the session 2021-22 to one student for each academic session to inculcate the reading habit among the students.



The college has a sexually harassment cell constituted by a group of faculty of the college. The cell guides the students under this cell through various activities like awareness programmes and seminar etc.

B. Xerox facility

The college authority offers Xerox facilities for every student at a very nominal rate.

C. COLLEGE TEACHERS' UNIT AID FUND:

The Teachers' Unit of the college extends a provision for students namely "Aid Fund to the meritorious students" who are seeking admission into different classes of the college. The facilities of this aid fund are available to those meritorious students who are not getting scholarships from any other sources.

D. NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS):

It is an important organization of the College functioning for past many years. The members of the NSS of this College render various benevolent services in the neighboring areas of the sub division. It unfolds the opportunities to the students to inculcate the spirit of fellow-feeling, friendliness and cooperation and service to the downtrodden people for their socioeconomic upliftment.

E. NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC):

Under 12 ASSAM (I) COY, Jyoti Gogoi College has a fully functional sub-unit, with 50 (Boys) strength.

F. GIRLS' HOSTEL

The college has a well secured Girls' Hostel. It provides seat accommodation for 40 students. The Hostel is well furnished and it provides pure drinking water and clean sanitation facilities. It has the provision for separate Visiting, Kitchen, Dining and Bedrooms. It also extends electronic audio-visual services e.g. television set at the dining room which is primarily meant for using to exploit the educational values of programmes by students.

G. REMEDIAL CLASSES:

In addition to the general classes, the college also provides the remedial coaching classes after the end of general routine classes each day. No additional fees will be charged for remedial classes. For details, contact at Principal's Office.

H. COLLEGE CANTEEN:

There is a college canteen within the college campus which is run in a free furnished structure provides by the college and supervised by a committee constituted for the purpose.

Regular practice and competition are held under the supervision of experienced teachers and students showing proficiency are encouraged to take part in the inter college competitions organized at various level.

We are very much glad to add here that recently we have completed the construction of our indoor stadium in Campus C which was funded by UGC. Students now can avail the sports facility in Badminton and Table Tennis in this indoor stadium.

J. Gymnasium:

The college has recently installed as up to date gymnasium block in the campus. It has been complete with a fund from RUSA (Rastriya Uchcharat Siksha Abhiyyan). About 20 students can practices at a time in this gymnasium.

GRIEVANCE CELL:

The college has constituted a Grievance Cell headed by Principal to look into and redress the grievance of the college employees (Teaching and Non-Teaching) and students.

ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION IN THE EVENT OF RAGGING:

The University shall issue an order to punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure, and in the manner prescribed here in under.

- A) The Anti-Ragging Committee of the Institution shall take appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendations of the anti-ragging squad.
- B) The anti-ragging committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the anti-ragging squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments:
 - I. Suspension from Attending Classes and Academic Privileges.
 - II. Withholding/ Withdrawing Scholarship/ Fellowship and other Benefits.
 - III. Debarring from Appearing in any Test/ Examination or other Evaluation Process.
 - IV. Withholding results.
 - V. Debarring from representing the institution in any Regional, National or International Meet, Tournament, Youth Festival, etc.
 - VI. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
 - VII. Cancellation of admission.
 - VIII. Rustication from the institution for a period ranging from one to four semesters.
 - IX. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
 - X. Fine of 10,000 /- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) or with imprisonment up to 6 months as per the Assam Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1999.
 - XI. To undertake patrolling and make surprise visits to places vulnerable to incidents of ragging.
