Introduction:

Joya Gogoi College was established in the year 1991 with an objective of providing quality educational opportunities to the students belonging to Khumtai and its surrounding region of Golaghat district. Khumtai and its surrounding areas has a diverse demographic profile with the people belonging Ahom, Kachari, Mishng, Tea-Tribes and Other Backward Classes. This unique feature of Khumtai region is reflected in the enrolment of the college since its inception. The students belonging to Schedule Tribe, Tea Tribe, Other Backward Classes, Minority Communities and Economically Backward Section of the society vastly outnumber the student belonging to unreserved categories. This is an opportunity as well as a challenge to impart quality higher education, given the socio-economic background of the students at the college. The college tries to mitigate these socioeconomic hindrances of the students by capitalising on the academic and co-curricular aspects for their rounded development. In short, the institution is trying to bring together the best standards of higher education as an **OUTPUT** from a socially and economically challenged **INPUT**.

Demographic profile of the students:

The College Admission Registrar is the primary source providing comprehensive data on student census, carried out annually during the time of admission. The college strictly adheres the reservation policy laid down by Govt. of Assam regarding admission of students for ST, OBC, SC and other quotas. According to this policy, 37% of the total admitted seats should be reserved for students belonging to ST, OBC and SC communities. However following facts are evident from the analysis of student enrolment data:

I. Number of admitted students from the other backward classes (OBC) is **two to three times** the number of allotted seats reserved for the same. This trend is repeated for the last five academic sessions.

II. Number of students admitted from ST category **fill up completely** the seats reserved for them.

III. The number of students admitted against the unreserved category is less than **15% of the total admitted students** for the last five academic sessions.

Student Fostering at College:

The college has not limited itself only in dealing with the curriculum but has adopted a holistic approach for the betterment of its students. There are four statutory bodies to look after the welfare of students belonging to reserved categories: The ST cell, OBC cell, Minority Cell as well as SC cell. These statutory bodies submit the admission extract of students to the state OBC/ST&SC council to smooth the process of achieving scholarships available to them. The state govt. fee waiver schemes during the admission have been utilized fruitfully by the college since the beginning of the scheme. A total of 2095 students are admitted under state govt. fee waiver schemes in the sessions 2018-19 to 2022-23, which is mere reflection of the poor economic background of the students. Not a few numbers of post matric scholarships reserved for OBC and ST/SC students are achieved by our students annually. Even students who are not meritorious are given opportunities to get admitted into the institution. They are given admission and equal treatment to experience the facilities available in the institution. Faculties use bilingual mode of interaction and explanation in the

classroom as majority of the students are from vernacular medium. A diverse classroom gives the student a place for pleasure and sharing experiences. This type of environment sensitizes student to respect every culture, believe and language. This also enhances the quality of teamwork.

Although maintaining the highest standards of achievement and performance in academics is at the heart of the college agenda, it also commits to co-curricular and personality development of the students. With these objectives, the college regularly organizes workshops, seminars, skill development as well as cultural programs which can inspire the students to turn their passions into professions. The college seeks to develop a deeper sense of community service among the students by engaging them in activities through the NSS unit of the college. The NCC unit of the college tries to inculcate qualities of character, courage, comradeship, discipline, leadership among the students and ready for the service of the Nation. The institute celebrates the commemorative days of local, national, and global significance to instil a deeper sense of individual, cultural and national identity among its students. Various activities are carried out at the departmental level for the rounded development of its students. Students are encouraged to respect cultural diversities through celebrations of different festivals in the campus. Festivals like Bihu, Saraswati Puja are celebrated with great enthusiasm. Freshers social, college week, various cultural programs and completions and rallies are organized to promote a unique bond among the students belonging to different communities. Field trips are conducted to introduce the students to outer world and provide exposure.

Off Campus Activity:

Joya Gogoi college is aware of the fabric of the society that its student represent. Majority of the students admitted under reserved categories hail from the remote rural villages and tea garden areas of neighbourhood. The college strives to strengthen social cohesion and visit the villages from time to time to motivate the families for educating their children so that they can pursue higher education. Various MOUs have been signed with the neighbouring feeder schools where the faculties used to do classes to motivate them for pursuing higher education. Science day, Storytelling days, Cultural diversity days, Blood donation days etc., are celebrated outside the campus to attract students belonging to the reserved communities. In this manner, college extends support and guidance to them to prepare for a better, fulfilling life.

Conclusion:

The college promote an environment in which all students feel valued, respected and have access to develop their critical thinking which increase happiness and productivity as well as encourage our students to be interculturally sensitive. This is because, unity in diversity enriches the development of trust and bonding among the students between different communities.

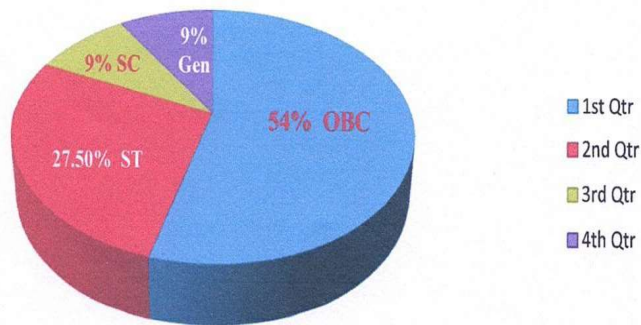

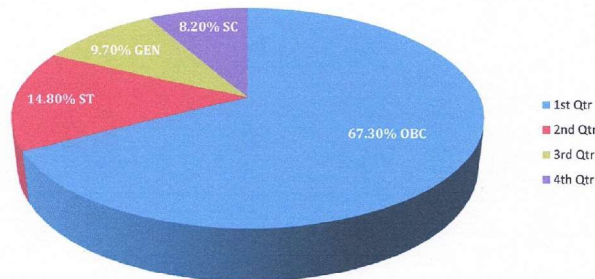

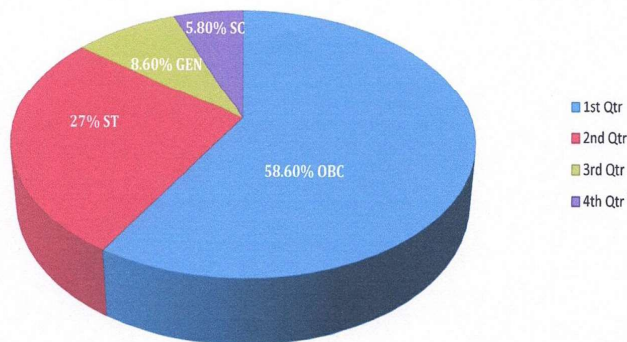
**PIE CHART OF STUDENT ENROLLED IN

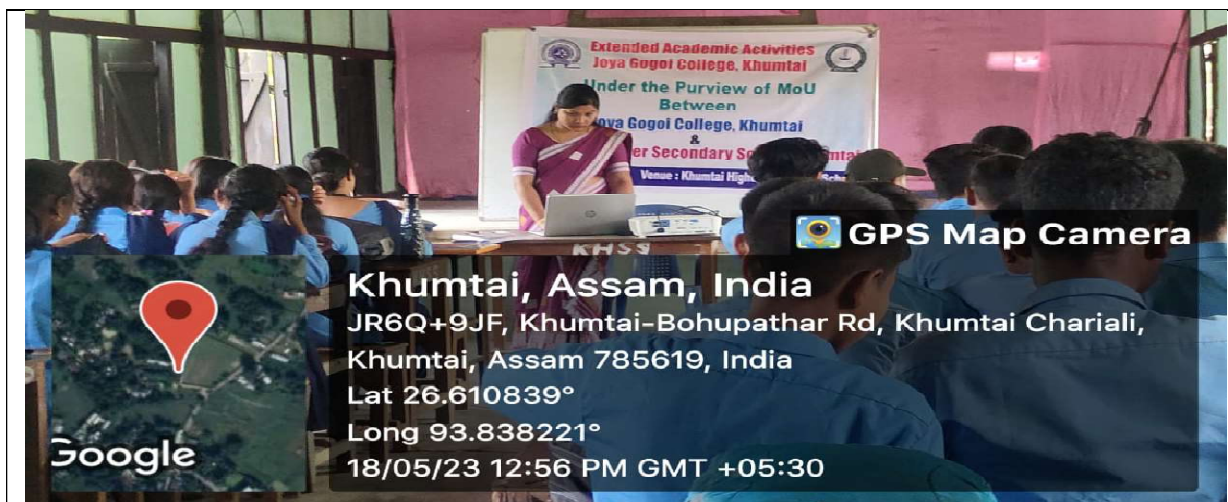

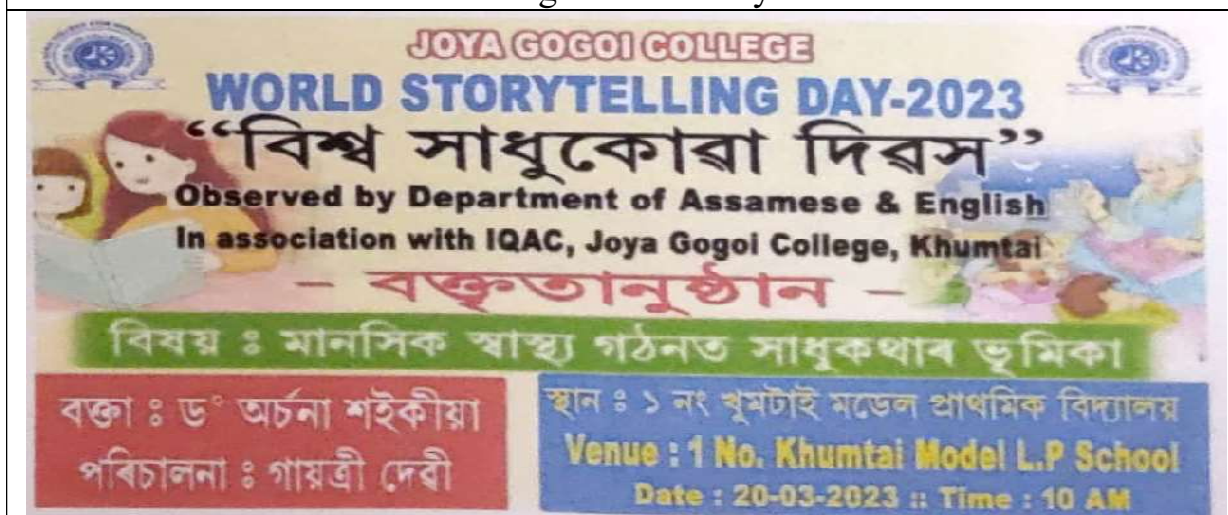

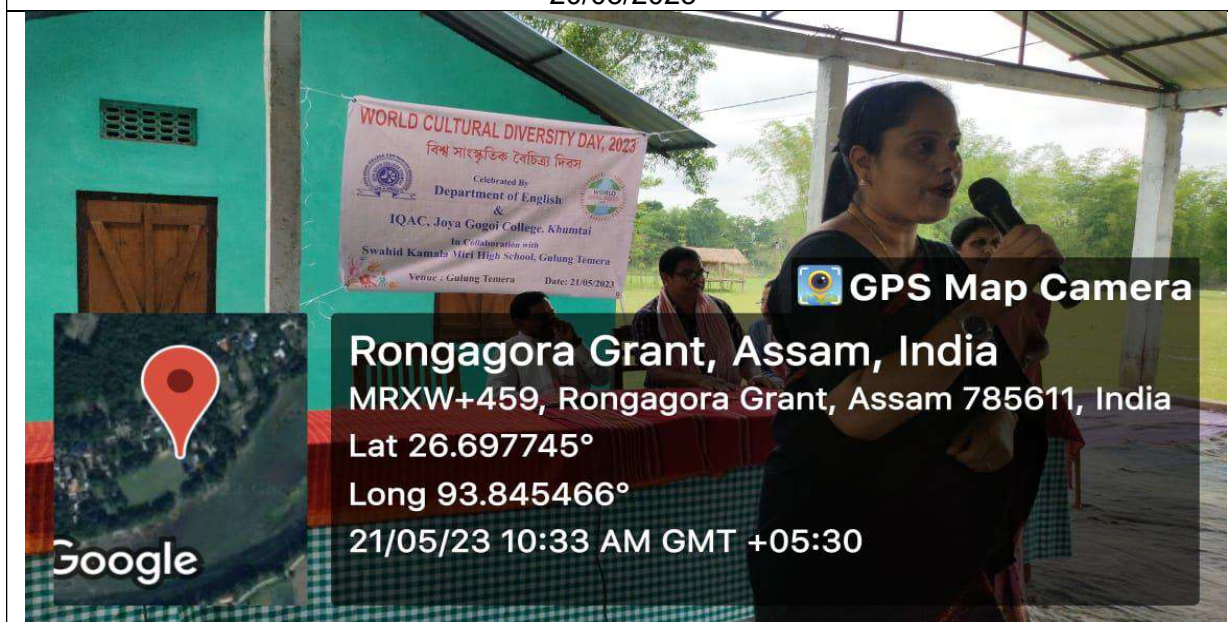
